Dollhouse Show and Sale in Mooresville, NC On October 10 the three Charlotte area NAME miniature clubs Mini Reflections, Indian Trail Mini Makers, and Miniature Collectors Society of Charlotte hosted the Second Annual North Carolina Dollhouse Miniature Show and Sale at the Hilton Garden Inn on Gateway Blvd in Mooresville. Members from all three clubs served on the committee, had dealer tables, brought exhibits and welcomed almost 200 guests. Free workshops for children took place all day and many door prizes were given out due to the generosity of

dealers and club members. Two area shops had dealer tables, PJ Miniatures of Albemarle, NC, and Miniature Designs of Lawrenceville, GA. Artisans came from Virginia, North and South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida. Additionally, the charity of the event was New Eyes For the Needy and 46 pairs of used eyeglasses and 20 eyeglass cases were collected and given to the Mooresville Lions Club. Since this was a nonprofit event, after expenses, money will be given to each club and to NAME.

Trick or Treat in Tennessee, Monteagle, TN. The East Tennessee Mini Makers gathered for trick or treating and mini-making at the DuBose Conference Center in Monteagle, TN, October 15-17. We couldn't have had a nicer weekend weather-wise! The fall colors were approaching peak, the temperature was crisp, nice for the bonfire and marshmallow roasting. This year we had five new attendees...Sharon Johnson, Denise Hollingsworth, Ann Parker and Lisa Thompson, and Marti Icenogle. The Old Mill, Unicoi Mini Weekend, Unicoi State Park, Helen < GA, November 13-15, 2015. For the third time about 100 miniature enthusiasts gathered at the Unicoi State Park Lodge in Helen, GA, to work on a small-scale miniature project. The first Mini Weekend, "Little Cabin in the Woods," was held at Unicoi in 1999, under the leadership of Marilyn Oakes and Jane Payne, The project for the second Mini Weekend in 2010, chaired by Rhonda Keef and Michelle Martinez, was a ½" scale Bavarian structure by a stream, particularly appropriate for Helen, which is known for its German (Bavarian) architecture and attractions.

The 2015 weekend, under the leadership Rhonda Keef and Janet Chase, was a ¼" scale mill inspired by the Nora Mill, a working grain mill on the Chattahoochee River in Helen, Georgia. The mill, dating back to 1876, continues to grind and produce such corn and wheat products as grits, cornmeal, and mixes for pancakes and waffles. The project was designed by Janet Chase, Jane Payne, Cat Wingler, and Debbie Young.

Participants came from all over the country, most from E-3, but also from as far away as the West Coast.

Work began Friday evening about 6 p.m. as participants assembled their structures, working until about 10 p.m., and we resumed work at 8 a.m., working until about 9 or 10 p.m. Saturday, with breaks for meals and for other activities such as roundtables, shoe-box sales, demonstrations of techniques useful in finishing the projects (Cat Wingler taught water techniques, Marie Bird how to make plaster rocks, Donna Brewington how to age with India ink, and Sandy Whipple texturizing insulation foam). There were also tote bags, exhibits, raffles, door prizes, mini-swaps, including a swap of mini-kits, and homemade refreshments appropriate for an autumn event. A special part of the workshop were the little committee gifts handed out at intervals during the workshop, including the ASSEMBLED water wheel for the mill. It was a great weekend, a great project, and everyone seemed to be having a wonderful time.

As far as we know another Unicoi weekend isn't in the works at this time because the committee, after a brief respite, is now tuning its attention to the E-13 Small Scales Houseparty, "Gals, Gangsters, & Gatsby" September 16-18, 2016, in Greenville, SC. See you there!
