The issue, as usual, is location and after a week of no response from the sales department at the hotel in Atlanta, I am resourcing some new locations. But we have a plan for the day! So - many of the E-3 team were involved with the Charleston Convention and are now looking to Nashville. Our busy schedules and all the work required by these two back-to-back events led to a thought for a different type of retreat - a Round Table Challenge - with an opportunity to get some minis completed - away from family, away from phones, away from housework and yard work - sharing fun and fellowship with mini friends and getting some of those hundreds of round table kits put together! So here is the challenge - over the holidays pull out your round table kits - select 10 that need to be completed for a future project or for a current project. (You may also want to clean out your stash and plan to bring along those kits that no longer fit a project or need as we will be putting together a grab stash for those who may not have kits or want to trade out for another kit! Come on and be honest - you know you have kits that you look at and wonder what you were thinking when you purchased them!) The kits cannot be started, they should still be in their bag/container. Check your instructions and see what paint, glues and tools are needed to complete them. Scale does not matter, the kits can be a variety of scales. The goal is to spend the day trying to complete all 10 (or more if you feel up to it)! We will offer prizes - most completed, quickest time, theme completions (all for one room, one house, one scene), etc. The cost will include lunch and charges for the venue - so hopefully less than \$30.00 - not the \$70.00 that a kit requires and we will still keep attendance to 50 participants. As soon as I have a venue and have all details together, I will send the information out in a separate email/snail mail at the first of the year. Thanks for your understanding and patience - we will do our best to make this happen!
