Piedmont Carolinas NAME Group. (C-862)/Miniature Enchantment (C-1033 Payments to clubs that participated in the 2013 Enchanted Village went out in early March. Clubs can earn points for participating in the Enchanted Village as exhibitors, monitors, judges, helping with set-up and move-out, and from these points earn money for their clubs. Miniature Enchantment is reimbursed by Southern Shows for coordinating the exhibit, and we use some of that money for charity, for donations to NAME, and to clubs that helped with the exhibit.

Forms for the 2014 Enchanted Village wll be going out in late June and are due to me by September 15. The categories for exhibits that earn cash awards are Houses (1" and $\frac{1}{2}$ " scales), Non-Residential Structures (1" and $\frac{1}{2}$ "), Room Boxes, Outdoor Scenes, and Small Scales. Spencer Doll and Toy Museum The Spencer Doll and Toy Museum (SDTM), North Carolina's only nonprofit museum dedicated to playthings, recently received a wonderful gift from the family of miniaturist Mary March. Mrs. March, a longtime Weaverville, NC, resident, had the shell of a seven-foot dollhouse built, but she lovingly decorated each room herself, buying or making each item over the span of 15 years.

While it may have taken Mrs. March years to create this amazing dollhouse, it only took the Board of Directors at the SDTM a few minutes to decide that the museum could create a permanent spot for this spectacular creation.

It all began just a few short weeks ago when the museum received a call from Mrs. March's daughter, Lynn Farber-- just days before a company from Georgia was supposed to come to the March home in Weaverville and take apart the doll house and sell off piecemeal the contents. Lynn found the Spencer Doll and Toy Museum – just in the nick of time. In previous weeks she'd been unable to find a home for the large house.

Through phone conversations, emails and photographs it was evident that this incredible dollhouse was worth preserving. Lynn told the SDTM how her mother designed it and had it built. She then papered, painted, wired and decorated and spent many hours on the house. No details were spared as she even made linens for all the beds (contour sheets, embroidered top sheets, quilts), petit point rugs and pillows. It is quite elaborate and detailed.

The library is designed to resemble the library in the Biltmore House – where Mrs. March had volunteered for many years as a docent.

Mrs. March had six children and always wanted a big family, which is why there are 12 dolls living in the house. They were handmade to her specs by a doll maker in Australia. Miniatures were Mrs. March's passion, and it's evident in her work.

Memphis Miniature Club's project for March was an "antique" paper one, called THE CHRISTMAS GARDEN. It was an all-day session as there was lots of cutting involved! This was a project from the December 1917 LADIES HOME JOURNAL. Maggie Miller discovered the one her mother had done many years ago while going through some family possessions. The tree is 8" tall and sits onto a 4"x 6" base. A village is displayed on this base. There are 56 pieces to be cut and assembled so not too many members actually completed theirs. Maggie's mother was a miniaturist and created her a dollhouse village in the 1940s. She was often taken to Chicago by train to see the famous Thorne Rooms and Colleen Moore's Fairy Castle. She still has many items in her large miniature collection that came from these excursions. Included are some very

interesting doll vignettes with dolls made from hickory nuts. These are labeled "The Hickory People" and were made by an artist named Elaine Cannon. These were sold at Marshall Fields in Chicago in the 1940's.
