MEET YOUR E-3 TEAM MEMBERS

I have been a member of NAME since the 1980s and have served on the Board of Trustees, as Region E-3 RC, as Membership Chairman, on the By-laws committee and on the regional teams. I currently serve as E-3 Publicity chair. I have served on multiple Houseparty and Convention committees, co-chairing the 2003 National along with Debbie Young.

I am a member of the NAME Academy of Honor (AOH) and was selected as a Fellow of the International Guild of Miniature Artisans (IGMA) in 1994.

All of the above means that I am always up for a party; I have a ball playing with my friends and don't know how to say no. I have loved and made miniatures all my life, and got serious about miniatures in the mid 1970s. I originally started as a dealer with miniature foods, painted wooden toys and country furniture. I have long since moved on to making figures and currently work in 1", 1/2" and 1/4" scales. I love teaching classes. Even though I am retired, I still collect and occasionally do an order.

I am married to Steve Wingler, have two sons and five granddaughters. After living in Wilkesboro, NC, for more than 40 years, we have retired and now live in Southport, NC.



A native of Minnesota, I moved to Charlotte, NC, to take a teaching position in Anthropology at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, where I taught for 30 years before retiring to become a full-time grandma. I have one daughter who has given me three delightful grandchildren. The oldest, now 10, has been doing minis with Nana since he was three.

My love of dollhouses and miniatures goes back to my childhood, when my sister and I built houses out of blocks on our bedroom floor (which allowed for creating different architectural designs and floor plans) and furnished them with Ideal plastic furniture, some of which we both still have. These houses were inhabited by paper dolls cut from Montgomery Ward catalogs (wardrobes created by making clothes for them, fulfilling my dress-designer ambitions of the time). If I wasn't playing with miniatures, I was playing with paper dolls or dolls (my favorites were my Madame Alexander Little Women dolls) and the small Wendy-dolls) and making clothes for them, But life intervened, and it wasn't until the mid-1980s, when I attended a show in Charlotte, that I found my way back to dolls and miniatures. I had always wanted a porcelain doll, so took some classes and got hooked. Then I started trying dollhouse-size dolls and entered the miniature show as a dealer about 1983. I learned about NAME and the Charlotte Miniature Society at that time, joined both, and, as they say, the rest is history. More recently I've started making garden flowers, starting with hollyhocks to fill up part of the Secret Garden, the E-3 Retreat project in 20 ...

I have been a member of NAME since 1984 and have served NAME in a variety of capacities starting as president of several clubs, including the Charlotte Miniature Society, Mini Reflections, and Piedmont Carolinas NAME Group, which coordinates the annual Enchanted Village dollhouse and miniature exhibit at Southern Shows' Christmas Show in Charlotte. I served as North Carolina State Rep under two Regional Coordinators, I was on and then chaired the NAME Museum Committee, edited the E-3 Resource Book when Cat Wingler was RC, and have been the E-3 Newsletter editor for both Amy Rauch and Marie Bird. I also have served on several Houseparty and Convention steering committees, including co-chairing "Autumn Elegance" in Greenville in 2002, and chaired the 2012 National Convention in Charlotte with Lynn Frank. And I

have served on the NAME Board of Trustees for two terms, from 2006 to 2010, as Club Liaison. Needless to say, I haven't had much time to work on my miniature projects, which are accumulating in closets and along the walls in my office. It's time for a Round Tuit week to get some of them done!

Region E-3 New Swap
Due Date: November 15, 2013
Butcher Shop

This is my third swap as your swap coordinator. I've had so very much fun doing these swaps, and I never cease being amazed at the talent exhibited. Many of you commented about possible choices for this swap, and I must admit I was a bit amazed at the outcome. We're doing a Butcher Shop. (It tied with In The Attic - so be patient, we will do that one next). But today we are talking BUTCHER SHOP.

When I think of butcher shop, I think of all sorts of things, some that only sell meat and others that sell all sorts of things to create a great dinner. Possible Choices: Meat, poultry, seafood, shell fish, condiments, items to cook meat, poultry, etc. in; table settings for a seafood meal, wine choices for the meat, aprons, knives, cutting boards, chopping blocks, to name only a few.

Our new E-3 Swap theme will let you create a Butcher Shop. We are doing the same theme in two scales: one inch and quarter inch scales. The field is wide open.

Deadline for submitting your swap items is November 15 2013. (I want to get the swap to you before the holiday rush begins.)

The swap is now open, so please follow the directions below.

Rules and Guidelines: This swap is only for NAME members in Region E-3. We are having swap groups for one inch scale and quarter inch scale. You may participate in one or both.

How It Works: Swappers are divided into swap groups and each person in a swap group will make or buy 10 identical items for the others in your group. You will receive 10 different items in return. (Be sure to make one for yourself, but don't send it to me).

Important: Please keep your items related to the current swap theme. Please send an item that you would love to receive.

Deadline: All boxes must be received by me no later than November 15, 2013. Any box received after that date will be returned to the sender at the sender's expense.

Cost: Please send a check or money order for \$5.75 made payable to Sheila Barker. This fee is to cover the cost of postage. This amount covers the cost of Priority Mail postage, a delivery confirmation, and packing materials. Please do not send cash or preprinted postage labels from the post office.

Registration: If you would like to participate in one or both of our Butcher Shop swaps, please email me at sab41946@aol.com. Please type E-3 Swap in your subject line. When I receive your email, I will acknowledge your

registration and email you my mailing address. You can also contact me at 305-292-0031. I will sign you up over the phone and give you my mailing address.

Checklist:

1. Email me at sab41946@aol.com, subject line E-3 Swaps or call me at 305-292-0031 to register.
2. Package each item individually to protect it; i.e., film canister or baggie. I'm not able to do this for you. Include your name AND AN EMAIL ADDRESS. Please include contact information so that fellow swappers can thank you. If you participate in both scales, please pack each scale in a separate large plastic bag.
3. ***Include a self-addressed mailing label so that I can attach it to your box of goodies
4. Include a check or money order for \$5.75 made payable to Sheila Barker. NO CASH PLEASE.
5. Mail your box to me so that I receive it no later than November 15, 2013.
6. If you sign up and decide that you cannot or do not want to participate, please let me know. Sometimes life gets in the way of miniature fun. We understand.
7. Sit back and wait for your box of goodies. Open alone or online with your mini friends.
8. Have fun.

SPECIAL NOTE: If we have less than 10 people sign up, we'll still swap. I will just return your "extras" to you for you to use elsewhere. If you do not want the extras, just say so when you mail me your items.

Please sign your full name to email when contacting me. It is so difficult to know who I am communicating with only an email address.

IF YOU KNOW NAME MEMBERS WHO HAVE SWAPPED IN THE PAST AND ARE INTERESTED IN THE SMALLER SCALE, PLEASE FORWARD THIS TO THEM. IF YOU BELONG TO CLUBS AND WANT TO SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH NAME MEMBERS, I'D BE DELIGHTED TO HAVE YOU SHARE THIS WITH THOSE WHO WANT TO PARTICIPATE.

If you know people who have swapped with us in the past and haven't, it could be they have changed their email address. It is very difficult to find these individuals, so please talk it up with your group. I don't want to eliminate anyone who wants to swap.

Looking forward to having great participation. The items in the last two swaps has been really fantastic. You don't want to miss it. Right now, you have over 100 days to complete your swap. Lots of time.
